Dear *Sir/Madam,*

Please refer to the quarterly advisories issued vide D.O. letters of no. 9/6/2010-PD-II/Vol.II including my last d.o. letter dated 29.04.2016 regarding lifting of the allocated foodgrains and various measures to be taken for strengthening and streamlining of Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS).

2. Government has enacted NFSA which has come into effect on 05.07.2013 and the States/UTs were required to implement the Act upto 31-03-2016. However, so far 33 States/UTs have implemented the NFSA and are being allocated foodgrains under the Act. But 3 States, viz., Nagaland, Tamil Nadu and Kerala have not yet completed pre-requisites to implement NFSA. These States are advised to implement the Act expeditiously. They are presently being allocated foodgrains as per erstwhile TPDS. As an exceptional measure, these three non NFSA States have also been allocated additional APL and BPL at APL & BPL prices from April, 2016.

3. It has been observed that the lifting upto June, 2016 is poor in the case of Punjab(54.9%), D&N Haveli(56%), Daman & Diu(28.4%), A&N Island(36.7%) and Manipur(40.4%). The lifting in case of other States like Bihar(83.8%), MP(75.6%), Mizoram(72.7%), Tamil Nadu(87.4%), etc., is also not satisfactory. The State-wise lifting position up to June, 2016 is at **Annexure-I**.

4. Under NFSA, the beneficiaries have a legal right to receive foodgrains in time and if the State Govt. fails to supply foodgrains in time, they are entitled to get food security allowance by the end of the third week of the following the month in which non-supply occurred. These states/UTs are advised that they may draw foodgrains for distribution under NFSA on monthly basis otherwise in the event of default; they will have to pay food security allowance as per the Act.

5. It is also informed that during the year 2015-16, Government of India had also allocated additional APL and BPL allocations to the States/UTs, which had not implemented NFSA, at APL and BPL prices, respectively. However, it has been observed that lifting of these additional APL and BPL allocations has been at 83.9% and 78.6%, respectively. The State/UT Governments are requested to ensure complete lifting of all the additional allocations given by Government of India and ensure distribution of the same to the targeted beneficiaries.

6. The South-West (SW) Monsoon has already set in. India receives maximum rainfall during the SW monsoon season for a period of about four months from June to September.

Around 70-90 percent of the annual total rainfall over different parts of India occurs in the SW monsoon season. Generally, floods occur during July to September.

The States/UTs, if they so desire, may distribute upto 6 months ration (foodgrains) in advance as per letter No. 4(7)/2011-PD-I dated 18th July, 2011 and 6th February, 2014 circulated earlier by this Department so that the beneficiaries of the remote, distant cut-off areas vulnerable to landslides, water logging, etc., do not suffer for want of foodgrains.

The States/UTs are requested to specifically review the availability of foodgrains in flood prone areas along with the general foodgrains availability situation in the State/UT with the local officers of Food Corporation of India (FCI) and communicate the demand/action plan to the FCI HQs., so that timely stocking can be ensured.

7. Further, as part of efforts being made for modernization of Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS), Department of Food and Public Distribution is implementing a Plan Scheme on End-to-end Computerization of TPDS Operations. End-to-end Computerization has become more important after coming into force of the National Food Security Act, under which prices of foodgrains to be distributed through the TPDS are highly subsidized. Under the Computerization scheme, costs are being shared on 90:10 basis in respect of North Eastern States and on 50:50 basis with other States/UTs.

8. Following are the key activities and their expected outcomes in the first phase:

- i. Digitization of Beneficiary Database - Enable correct identification of beneficiaries; removal of bogus cards and better targeting of food subsidies.
- ii. Computerization of Supply Chain Management - Timely availability of foodgrains to intended beneficiaries at FPS; check leakages/diversion.
- iii. Grievance Redressal Mechanism and Transparency Portal - Introduce transparency & public accountability in the implementation of TPDS.

9. The Department conveyed administrative approval for the scheme to all States/UTs on 10.12.2012. The Scheme has been declared as a Mission Mode Project (MMP) by the Government. National Informatics Centre (NIC) is the technical partner under the scheme and has also developed a Common Application Software (CAS) which has been offered to all States/UTs, NIC, etc. Funds of Rs. 327.49 crore have been released to 30 States/UTs, NIC, etc., during financial years 2012-13 (Rs.41.69 crore), 2013-14 (Rs.187.05 crore), 2014-15 (Rs.34.35 crore), 2015-16 (Rs. 59.85 crore) and 2016-17 (Rs. 4.55 crore) (upto 31.05.2016) under the scheme. A statement on release of funds to States/UTs, NIC, etc. is at **Annexure-II**.

10. A National Transparency Portal <http://pdsportal.nic.in> has been developed by NIC through which citizens may access the Portals of the respective State/UT Food and Civil Supplies Departments.

11. Based on the reports received from States/UTs and NIC, the activity-wise progress in States/UTs is at **Annexure-III**. All States/UTs have also been requested to seed available Aadhaar numbers and bank account numbers of beneficiaries in the ration card database.

12. Further, in consultation with NIC, Department of Electronics & Information Technology (DeitY) and Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI), this Department has prepared guidelines for Fair Price Shop (FPS) automation, which were sent to all States/UTs on 11.11.2014. FPS automation involves, installation of Point of Sale (PoS) devices at FPS for authentication of beneficiaries, recording of sales to beneficiaries at the FPS; and uploading of

transaction data in central server. As per the said guidelines, NIC is entrusted to develop software for PoS device and overall solution. This Department has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with STQC Directorate (attached office of DeitY) on 07.01.2015 for testing of PoS device. As regards financial assistance, Government has approved FPS dealers' margins (@ Rs. 87/qtl.) under NFSA which also includes reimbursement of Rs. 17/qtl. for their expenditure towards purchase and operations of the PoS/Mobile Tablet device at the FPS for automation. So far, more than 1,21,942 FPSs are automated across the country.

13. For checking of leakage and diversions, this Department is also pursuing with States/UTs to opt for Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) under which subsidy component will be credited to bank accounts of beneficiaries to ensure their entitlement who will be free to buy foodgrains from anywhere in the market. For taking up this model, pre-requisites for the States/UTs would be to complete digitization of beneficiary data and seed bank account details of beneficiaries. The scheme has been implemented in UTs of Chandigarh and Puducherry w.e.f. September, 2015 and Dadra & Nagar Haveli w.e.f. first March, 2016 respectively on pilot basis. In Chandigarh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Puducherry 1.99 lakh, 0.30 lakh and 5.90 lakh beneficiaries respectively are covered under DBT (cash transfer) scheme at present.

14. I would also like to refer to this Department's letter dated 16.09.2015 and subsequent reminders wherein all States/UTs have been requested to furnish information on various aspects of implementation of TPDS in 17 proformas online. These letters have been sent vide email as well as by post to all States/UTs. I would like you to immediately furnish the online information for the period ending 31.03.2015 and 31.03.2016 (annually) as well as for the quarters ending 31.03.2015, 30.06.2015, 30.09.2015, 31.12.2015, 31.03.2016 and 30.06.2016 so that the information can be compiled centrally in this Department. The online information for subsequent quarters/annual periods afterwards may also be furnished on regular basis.

15. Further, as per clause 8(3) of the TPDS (C) Order, 2015, the State Government shall ensure, through the authorised agency, physical delivery of foodgrains to the fair price shop (FPS) by end of the month preceding the allocation month and in any case not later than the first week of the allocation month. States/UTs are advised to ensure door-step delivery of foodgrains to the FPS and to furnish door-step delivery information to this Department as per door-step delivery proforma at the earliest.

16. I shall be thankful if you look into the above issues and inform the action taken on the same at the earliest.

ANNEXURE II

End to End Computerization of TPDS: Actions to be taken by States/UTs

In order to ensure efficient, transparent and targeted delivery of subsidies to eligible beneficiaries, it is recommended that all the States/UTs should ensure meeting the following indicators w.r.t. various components of TPDS Computerization.

A. Digitization:

- Availability of ration cards and beneficiaries related information and summary reports on State Transparency Portal in a drill down manner till Ration Card Level
- Bifurcation of NFSA & Non-NFSA Categories in reporting formats
- Availability of ration card related information in public domain
- Availability of summary reports for addition, deletion and modification of ration cards on State Transparency Portal
- Availability of requisite information in public domain without password protection on a real time basis

B. Online Allocation

- Availability of monthly allocation reports on State Transparency Portal in a drill down manner till FPS Level
- Bifurcation of NFSA & Non-NFSA Categories in reporting formats

C. Supply Chain Automation

- Availability of stock register for all godowns in public domain on State Transparency Portal
- Availability of Release Orders, Truck Challans, Gate Pass, Delivery Confirmation and other supply chain related information on the State Transparency Portal
- Availability of requisite information in public domain without password protection on a real time basis

D. Grievance Redressal

- Availability of online grievance redressal facility on State Transparency Portal
- Availability of Tracking Facility on State Transparency Portal
- Availability and visibility of Toll Free Numbers (1800 series, 1967) on State Transparency Portals
- Availability of summary reports related to Grievances received, resolved, pending and rejected on State Transparency Portal
- Availability of escalation matrix on State Transparency Portal
- Availability of DGRO, State Food Commission, Vigilance committee related details and reports on State Transparency Portal
- Availability of requisite information in public domain without password protection on a real time basis

E. FPS Automation

- Availability of the real time transaction details and summary reports till FPS Level for all the automated FPSs on State Transparency Portal
- Bifurcation of NFSA & Non-NFSA Categories in reporting formats
- Availability of details related to Aadhaar authentication, type of commodity and time stamp related information for all transactions
- Availability of current stock position and closing balance for all FPSs
- Availability of requisite information in public domain without password protection on a real time basis

F. SMS Facility

- Availability of Online SMS Subscription Facility for Stock Movement, Grievance Redressal and FPS Transactions on State Transparency Portal
- Availability of SMS related summary reports on State Transparency Portal
- Availability of requisite information in public domain without password protection on a real time basis

G. Aadhaar Seeding: The full benefits of FPS automation and end-to-end TPDS computerization cannot be realized if the transactions are not Aadhaar Authenticated. The various alternate mechanisms which the States/UTs can employ to speed up Aadhaar Seeding include

- States/UTs can coordinate with UIDAI for organizing Aadhaar enrolment camps in the Districts/Taluks, etc. where Aadhaar generation is very low.
- Leverage the network of FPS Shops to collect Aadhaar Details with or without e-POS machines
- Utilize Advance Search facility provided by UIDAI to search and seed Aadhaar numbers of beneficiaries awaiting delivery of their Aadhaar cards
- Coordinate with Department of Post / local postal officials to speed up the delivery of Aadhaar cards to citizens.
- Conduct public awareness campaigns and make use of IEC tools for increasing Aadhaar Seeding in Ration Cards database. (Conduct camps, distribute leaflets, advt. on radio/newspapers, etc.)
- Leverage the network of Anganwadi workers and other local functionaries
- Employ inorganic mechanisms (e.g. NPR, SRDH)
- Self Aadhaar seeding via Web portal
- Regular meets and follow-ups with field level officers by senior leadership
